

Medications For Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD)

MOUD is an effective, clinically proven treatment that helps people in their recovery. People recover differently - one way people recover is with MOUD.

MOUD is the use of FDA approved medications, typically alongside counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a "whole-patient" approach to the treatment of opioid use disorders (OUD).

Research shows that for many, a combination of medication and therapy can successfully treat OUD, sustain recovery, and prevent or reduce opioid overdose.

PROCESS

 Medication binds to opioid receptors

Medication binds to opioid receptors but does not completely activate them

 Medication blocks activation of opioid receptors

EFFECTS

 Relieves cravings and withdrawal symptoms

Reduces withdrawal symptoms and cravings

 Prevents all opioids from causing euphoria

DISPENSING

 On site daily at Opioid Treatment Programs
